

Sport Premium

At St Mary and St Margaret's CE Primary School, we believe PE & Sport are an essential element of a balanced and purposeful curriculum. We believe that PE & Sport have the potential to change young people's lives for the better – physically, socially and emotionally. The high priority we already give to PE is reflected in numerous recent successes and awards (including School Games Mark Award and winners of Solihull Borough Small School Athletics 2022), as well as our award as Solihull Sports Primary School of the Year in 2013.

In the academic year 2023-24, among other awards we achieved:

- School Games Gold Mark Award for our participation in Coventry, Solihull & Warwickshire School Games
- Small Schools Solihull Borough Athletics Champions
- Y3 Gymnastics County Finals
- Y3 Speed Stacking County Finals
- KS1 Silver Medals at North Solihull KS1 Gymnastics Competition
- High 5 Netball Quarter Finalists

We therefore welcome the Government's continued funding to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. We are committed to using this resource in further developing high quality PE lessons, alongside greater opportunities for sporting competitions and clubs for all our young people.

What does the Sport Premium mean for our School?

'Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this' (DfE June 2013). At St Mary and St Margaret's we have split up the funding by the five key areas for consideration. Below is information about how we have spent the funding and the impact this is having.

In previous years, we have used our Sport Premium funding in a wide range of ways, including (among other things) increasing the range of sporting and competitive activities available to pupils (and thus increasing the number of pupils taking part and the frequency with which they do so), supporting pupils with transport to competitions, cover and training to develop staff expertise in teaching a range of sports and physical activities and the purchase of equipment.
