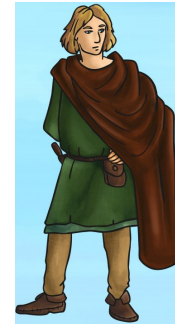


The Anglo Saxons

The Anglo Saxons were invaders from Germany, Denmark and Holland who settled in Britain. Britain became divided into different Kingdoms that each had its own King. Sometimes these The Anglo Saxons lived in wooden huts small villages. Many Anglo Saxons were poor and often children would not go to school. The men would have jobs such as farming, making weapons and jewellery or hunting. Women and girls would do jobs to look after the village but boys would train to become vicious warriors. The Anglo Saxons believed in a number of Gods but it was during this period that Britain became Christianised.

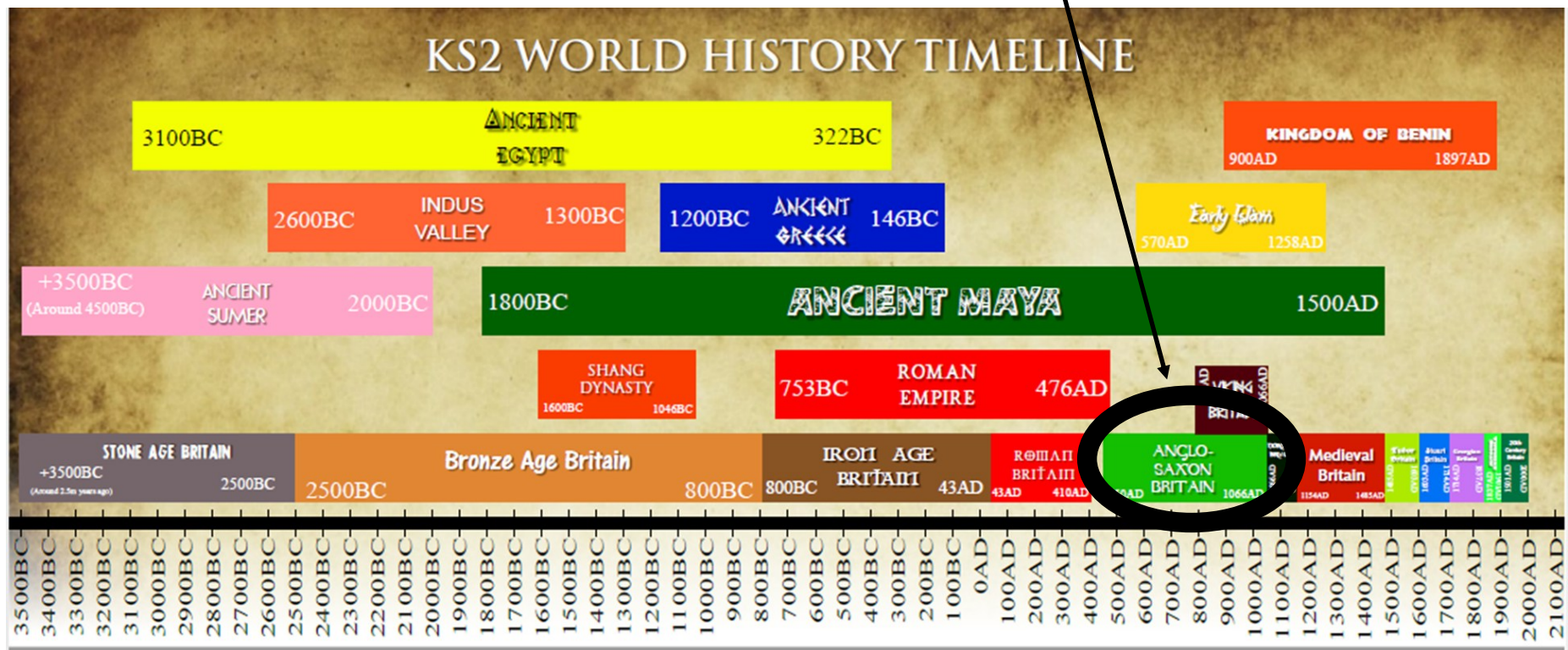
Legacy: many trades such as blacksmiths have been passed on from generation to generation.
